The Board had met with First Commonwealth Advisors regarding the two township Defined Benefit Pension Plans. They have determined that the ratio of 60/40 is not to be changed moving forward. There is a new investment policy statement covering investments for both plans that state this request.

- Mr. Lehman moved to approve the First Commonwealth Advisors Investment Policy Statement for: Richland Township Police and Supervisors Defined Benefit Pension Plans with no changes, seconded by Mr. Saylor. All in favor.

Memo From Rick Pollino, Police Chief – Request To Hire Full Time Police Officer Jacob Rhoades, effective October 20, 2025

A memorandum was received from Chief Rick Pollinio, recommending that the Board hire Jacob Rhoades as a full time Police Officer, effective October 02, 2025, at \$20.00 per hour.

- Mr. Wingard moved to hire Jacob Rhoades as a Full Time Police Officer, following all Probationary guidelines for new hires, specifically contingent upon passing the conditional offer of employment effective October 20, 2025, seconded by Mr. Saylor. All in favor.
